GENERAL MEETING MINUTES
August 15, 2012

BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT: Francie Carr, Doug Lewis, Tim Heitzman, CC Williams, Denny Prichard for Randy Babich, Peg Bingham

Meeting called to order at 7:06 by Treasurer Francie Carr.

Agenda presented for approval. Motion made, seconded and approved.

REPORTS:

SECRETARY: Peg Bingham asked to have the Minutes of the last meeting approved. Motion made, seconded and approved.

TREASURER: Francie Carr reported that building rentals remain below expectations and marina revenue is on target. The Croquet Tournament was a success with the LIC netting approximately \$1400 which included \$400 for sale of brats and \$1000 for registration money. The KPCCA netted approximately \$4800 which included a grant from the LIC of \$1382 from bribe money and sponsorships. Francie thanked Tim for his hard work and Tim in turn thanked his crew for the tournament.

Building expenses are below budget and the marina expenses are above the projection through July.

D & O insurance has been paid and we have requested a quote for next year's insurance. The checking account balance is \$77,521 through the end of July.

BUILDING AND GROUNDS: Doug Lewis reported that a new toilet had been installed in the men's room. Loud cheers. Two window panes have been installed and small electrical problems repaired. He would like to form a small committee not to do work but to come with ideas for future projects for the building that can be taken to the board. If you would like to serve on this committee please let Doug know. He also requested that if any member notices something broken or needing repair in the building or on the grounds to please let him know.

MEMBERSHIP: CC Williams announced that we had 169 members. CC thanked the evening's hostesses, Norma Larson, Jo Hamilton, A.J. Million and Barb Van Bogart. She asked for volunteers to serve at next month's meeting. Sandy and Cindi Black volunteered.

MARINA: Denny Prichard said the marina was doing pretty well and was selling lots of ice right now. Lynn Carr is very, very busy and seems to be at the dock 6 – 8 hours a day. The WiFi and security cameras are working. There have been gas thefts on the dinghy dock at night and the cameras did not pick them up because it was dark, but they are working on that aspect of the problem. Francie Carr said she lives across the bay from the marina and can pick up the WiFi from her home. She also reported that the DNR put another notice on Craig's boat anchored out in the harbor, so maybe it will soon be removed.

EVENTS: Tim Heitzman has advance tickets for sale for the Labor Day Dance. At the committee meeting they recapped the Croquet Tournament which was a big success and made some notes for next year to make it even better. Great food, great beer on tap, had 22 teams and the judges took in \$1700 in bribes. The dance is coming up, we do not have a captain for it, so Tim is the one to talk to about the dance. He passed around a sign-up sheet for volunteers. He is planning on running a tight ship without a lot of people standing around. Carolyn Wiley is handling the publicity and Doug and Betty Lewis are chairing the decorations committee, Help is still needed for bartenders, bar backs and set-up. We especially need hospitality to greet the boaters when they arrive and get them inside and hopefully up to the bar. The kitchen will be serving food. We need a couple security people to wander around and keep an eye on things. The membership will be called in the next couple weeks if not enough volunteers sign up to help at the dance. Cheryl Samuels is here giving a couple workshops on Indian weaving. This is a LIC event and is sold out. Save Saturday, October 6th for the Fiber Arts Show which has something for everyone.

OLYMPIA SCHOONER COMPANY AND THE MOSQUITO FLEET SUSTAINABLE SHIPPING PROJECT TO VISIT BOSTON HARBOR, LONG BRANCH AND SOUTH SOUND COMMUNITIES

July 1st, 2012 marked the return of the historic "Mosquito Fleet" to the Key Peninsula. The endeavor got its start in "Business and Sustainability," a program at The Evergreen State College. Its goal is to establish an entirely alternative, emissions-free shipping service, and to bring together local farms, businesses, and South Sound communities.

Mark your calendars for Sunday, September 23. This will be the fifth delivery to Boston Harbor Marina. The Schooner *Pleiades* will arrive at 9am-9:30 am on the outer dock of the marina, with a load of produce, and passengers. We will then depart for Longbranch, arriving between 2 and 3pm for our fourth delivery to Longbranch.

The business model of transporting cargo, goods, produce, and passengers--in a sustainable manner--is viable and will continue to increase in importance with rising oil prices, and with the logged I-5 corridor beginning to limit transport of commodities around Western Washington.

Hoyle Hodges--owner of the Olympia Schooner Company and Captain of the *Pleiades*--said, "I can sail from Olympia to Long Branch almost as fast as a truck can drive there, even faster, with the right currents and weather conditions" "Doing this in a sustainable manner, without contributing to the pollution of our beautiful Pacific Northwest environment, is our goal".

The Mosquito Fleet of the last century was a major influence on building community around the Puget Sound. Today the Olympia Schooner Company wants to take that same sense of community and bring it back in a sustainable manner. By delivering local goods and produce they can contribute to our local economy, in these hard economic times, and bring a network of individuals, families, and businesses together.

Hodges said, "We want to establish a regular route with set dates and times between Olympia, Boston Harbor, Long Branch, Steilacoom and other South Sound communities transporting goods and passengers both ways. Our last delivery to Boston Harbor included a full selection of organic fruits and vegetables and was filmed by a King 5 News crew."

The schooner and its crew were met at Longbranch with applause from locals--who recognize the importance of the Mosquito Fleet, and the return of this sustainable maritime culture to Southern Puget Sound. Members of the crew described how the produce--from organic farmers and vendors at the Olympia Market--is "biked to the boat," by Evergreen students.

The Evergreen State College and its Business Sustainability class were the inspiration to move the Mosquito Fleet concept into an actual project, and further into its current business form with the Olympia Schooner Company and the S/V *Pleiades*. Professors and faculty members Rebecca Chamberlain and Bob McIntosh continue to mentor and assist their current and former students.


