GENERAL MEETING MINUTES
March 18, 2015**

LIC Membership Meeting on 03/18/19 in the LIC lobby was called to order at 7:00 PM

Program: Karmela Little RN BSN from St. Anthony's Hospital in Gig Harbor gave a slide show presentation on "Falls - Impact and Prevention. She is in charge of the Trauma Services, and said that injuries from falling now outnumber injuries from car crashes. 1 out of 3 people 65 and older will have a serious fall. If you are in the 75 and older group, you are 4 to 5 times more likely to be admitted to emergency from a fall related injury. Women more often than men are injured from falling. When Ms. Little asked us why we thought that was the case, a woman LIC member, being an Improver rather than an Improvee, suggested it was because men are less likely to get up off the couch.

Ms. Little suggests that we all consider using a home safety check list. Also, a good exercise program will go far towards prevention of injuries from falling.

CONTRACTOR REPORTS

LIC Dockmaster: Lynn Carr reports that there was a fair amount of boating activity at the LIC Marina considering the weather this last month. Lynn says that there is plenty of Spring clean up needed at the dock if anyone is looking for volunteer hrs: pressure washing the deck, painting the flag pole, weed whacking the parking lot, clean the BBQ, replacing the rotten deck planks. March 2015 Building and Grounds Chat room:

The new dishwasher arrived today and is waiting to be installed. Thanks to Lynn, Gayle, Clark, Delia, and Kerry for helping get it in the building and unpacked. The main news this month is Spring Clean-up which will be held April 11-12 starting at 9:00AM. We usually do not have to go into the second day but it is available if anyone needs some hours but can't make Saturday-that is providing all the work does not get done.

The following is a partial list of projects that are waiting to get done;

Interior: Wash windows (inside and out), check out upholstered chairs for needed repairs and spot cleaning, paint cabinet under kitchen sink and the back splash area around the hand washing sink, clean out corner next to sound/electric room and sort out items on top of sound room, fix door under kitchen sink to allow it to close, check round tables for repair needs and tape removal, remove cobwebs from corners and windows.

Exterior: clean gutters, remove old stage and wood from behind building, power wash plastic strips in dumpster area fence, rehang dumpster gate, clean off south porch area, repaint address post, fill in holes at ends of driveways with gravel, general weed eating, replace wood edging along flower beds, clean out storage shed (make some determination on old hand washing sinks that we can no longer use due to county restrictions on hand washing, remove dying tree from front yard area, clean out flower beds if needed.

These are just some of the items that need to be done to give the Old Girl her spring face lift.
